MEMORANDUM FOR CIVCAS Team, Combined Joint Task Force - Operation Inherent Resolve, APO, AE 09306
SUBJECT: CIVCAS Credibility Assessment Report (CCAR) for (b)(1)1.4a (CJFLCC-OIR CCAR 003/17)
1. BLUF: This allegation is credible. A thorough review of all available evidence indicates that is it more likely than not that civilians were killed or seriously injured as a result of this strike.
2. CIVCAS Allegation:
a. Source: (b)(1)1.4a, (b)(6) the servicing asset, reported the potential CIVCAS to the CAOC after reviewing post-strike footage.
b. Time and Location: (b)(1)1.4z on 13JAN2016 IVO (b)(1)1.4z
c. Description: The CJOC-E engaged an ISIL defensive fighting position at b)(1)1.4z with (b)(1)1.4a The CJOC-E authorized a re-attack on the same target at 0)(1)1.4z using (b)(1)1.4a After reviewing post-strike footage, (b)(1)1.4a, (b)(6) reported that, following the first munition impact, four adults and four children were observed in the center of the building. After the re-attack only three persons could be observed in the vicinity of the building. (b)(1)1.4a, (0)(6) consequently assessed that five civilians had been killed or seriously injured as a consequence of the strike.
3. Strike Narrative: The following is a chronological breakdown of the strike based on analysis of relevant mIRC logs, FMV footage, and post-strike assessments.
a. At approximately (b)(1)1.4z ISR asset, (c)(1)1.4a, (b)(6) identified a building from which ISIL fighters were engaging friendly forces 120m to the southeast. At (b)(1)1.4a, (b)(6) identified four ISIL fighters within the building.
b. The CJOC-E TEA approved a strike request on the buildings at b)(1)1.4z under ROEtb)(1)1.1using (b)(1)1.4z from XCAS asset (b)(1)1.4a, (b)(6). At (c)(1)1.4a, (b)(6) engaged the target, however, due to a weapons malfunction only one munition was released. At b)(1)1.4z the CJOC-E authorized re-attack with the (b)(1)1.4z (b)(6). The munition impacted at b)(1)1.4z. The assessed battle damage assessment from the CJOC-E was one building functionally destroyed and 8xEKIA.
