Yaqein reported that the Coalition killed 21 civilians, 'mostly women and children' and wounded ten others included 7 children. A source told Yaqein that "the bombing focused on the areas of Saada and al-Obeidi," and destroyed four houses along with seven cars belonging to civilians. Muntathar al Zaidi Al Harari put the number of injured at 13. News of Iraq put the death toll at 9 (all from one family), while Al Gharbia reported that 12 civilians had died and identified one victim—a child named Ayham Ibrahim Jassam. In an emailed response to a report submitted by Airwars on this and other incidents in December 2016. Coalition officials said the event was presently assessed as 'Not credible.'
